1. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Short title. Parcel Post Amendment (No. 8) Warrant 1904.

2. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Warrant to be Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1902,* and all Warrants amend- read with ing the same.

3. On every outgoing parcel addressed to the British Somali-Rates to land Protectorate there shall be charged and paid the rates of British postage following, that is to say:-

Somaliland.

If exceeding three pounds and not exceeding seven pounds in weight	2 0	3 0

4. Except by permission of the Postmaster-General there Maximum shall not be forwarded, conveyed or delivered by post under this weight and Warrant any parcel the weight of which shall exceed eleven pounds or the dimensions of which shall exceed three feet six inches in length or six feet in length and girth combined.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 22nd Commenceday of February, 1904.
