

THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 1,
WARRANT, 1923. DATED SEPTEMBER 8, 1923.

1923. No. 1105.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, 1908 to 1920,^(a) and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) and under

the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct, and declare as follows :—

Warrant to be read as one with the Principal Warrant.
Repeal.

1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Warrant, 1921^(a) (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant").

2. On and from the date upon which this Warrant comes into operation, paragraph (7) of Regulation 1 of the Principal Warrant shall be repealed, and the following paragraph shall be substituted therefor :—

Definition of "gold bullion" and "silver bullion."

" (7) The expressions ' gold bullion ' and ' silver bullion ' mean uncoined and un-manufactured gold or silver (as the case may be)."

Repeal.

3. On and from the date when this Warrant comes into operation, paragraph (a) of Regulation 17 (relating to Prohibitions) of the Principal Warrant shall be repealed, and the following paragraph shall be substituted therefor :—

Prohibition.

" (a) any parcel containing coin or gold bullion exceeding five pounds in value, or any parcel containing silver bullion, or silver partly manufactured, exceeding twenty pounds in value; or "

Short Title.

4. This Warrant may be cited as the Foreign and Colonial Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Warrant, 1923.

Commencement of Warrant.

5. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 10th day of September, 1923.
