

The British Commonwealth and Foreign Parcel Post Amendment (No. 5) Warrant 1957

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by sections 5, 8, 15 and 81 of the Post Office Act 1953 and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same), and under the hands of two of us, the said Commissioners, order, direct and declare as follows:—

- 1.—(1) This Warrant shall be read as one with the British Commonwealth and Foreign Parcel Post Warrant, 1950 (hereinafter called "the Principal Warrant") and all Warrants amending the same.
(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889 applies to the interpretation of this Warrant as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
2. The following provisions of the British Commonwealth and Foreign Parcel Post Amendment (No. 4) Warrant, 1957 (which comes into operation on the 1st day of October 1957) are hereby revoked, and accordingly shall not come into operation:
 - (a) Regulation 6 (which substitutes the scale of registration fees and maximum compensation set out in the First Schedule thereto for the scale in Part III of the Second Schedule to the Principal Warrant as substituted by regulation 3 of the British Commonwealth and Foreign Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1952);
 - (b) The First Schedule;
 - (c) Such of the provisions of the Second Schedule as amend regulations 19 (2), 23 (2) and 23 (3) of the Principal Warrant and as revoke regulations 3 and 5 of the British Commonwealth and Foreign Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1952.
3. This Warrant may be cited as "The British Commonwealth and Foreign Parcel Post Amendment (No. 5) Warrant, 1957," and shall come into operation on the 30th day of September 1957.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Warrant, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

This Warrant relates to the registration fees and maximum compensation on parcels transmitted from one British postal agency to another in the Persian Gulf. It preserves the scale in the British Commonwealth and Foreign Parcel Post Amendment (No. 2) Warrant, 1952, by revoking the new scale in the British Commonwealth and Foreign Parcel Post Amendment (No. 4) Warrant, 1957, before that new scale takes effect.
