We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) order, direct and declare as follows:-

- 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Warrant to Colonial Post Warrant, 1898, and all Warrants amending the same.
- 2. The Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1898,* shall apply to letters transmitted to and from Cape Colony as if that letters to and Colony were specified in the Second Schedule to the said from Cape Warrant.
- 3. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Short title. Post (Amendment No. 4) Warrant, 1899."
- 4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the first day of Commence-September, One thousand eight hundred and ninety-nine.
