THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST (AMENDMENT No. 5) WARRANT 1900

DATED MAY 22, 1900.

We, the Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the Post Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of Her Majesty's Postmaster General (testified by his signing the same), order, direct, and declare as follows:—

- 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1898 (hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Warrant"), and all Warrants amending the same.
- 2. In lieu of the postage of twopence halfpenny per half ounce, or fractional part of half an ounce, payable on an outgoing letter from Constantinople, or any other place in the Ottoman Empire, there shall be charged and paid a rate of 40 paras in Turkish currency.
- **3.** For the purpose of clause 12 of the Principal Warrant, 40 paras shall, in the case of an outgoing letter from Constantinople or any other place in the Ottoman Empire, be regarded as the equivalent of twopence halfpenny sterling.
- **4.** This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Post (Amendment No. 5) Warrant, 1900."
- 5. All copies of the Principal Warrant, printed after the date of this Warrant, shall be printed as amended by this Warrant.
- 6. This Warrant shall come into operation on the 1st day of June, 1900.
