THE FOREIGN AND COLONIAL POST (AMENDMENT No. 8) WARRANT, 1902. DATED APRIL 25, 1902.

We, the Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in exercise of all powers given to us by the l'ost Office Acts, or any of them, and of all other powers enabling us in this behalf, do, by this Warrant, made on the representation of His Majesty's Postmaster-General (testified by his signing the same) order, direct, and declare as follows:—

Warrant to be read with existing Warrants. 1. This Warrant shall be read as one with the Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1898,* and all Warrants amending the same.

Rates of postage on letters to and from British Postal Agencies in China. Short title,

- 2. The Foreign and Colonial Post Warrant, 1898, shall apply to letters transmitted to and from the British Postal Agencies in China as if those Agencies were respectively specified in the Second Schedule to the said Warrant.
- 3. This Warrant may be cited as "The Foreign and Colonial Post (Amendment No. 8) Warrant, 1902."

Commencement. 4. This Warrant shall come into operation on the First day of May, 1902.
